People contact us for many reasons: housing, transportation, meals, caregiving, benefits assistance, in-home care options and more!

When you call, you'll speak with a specialist who will ask you a few questions to better understand your needs and eligibility for specific programs.

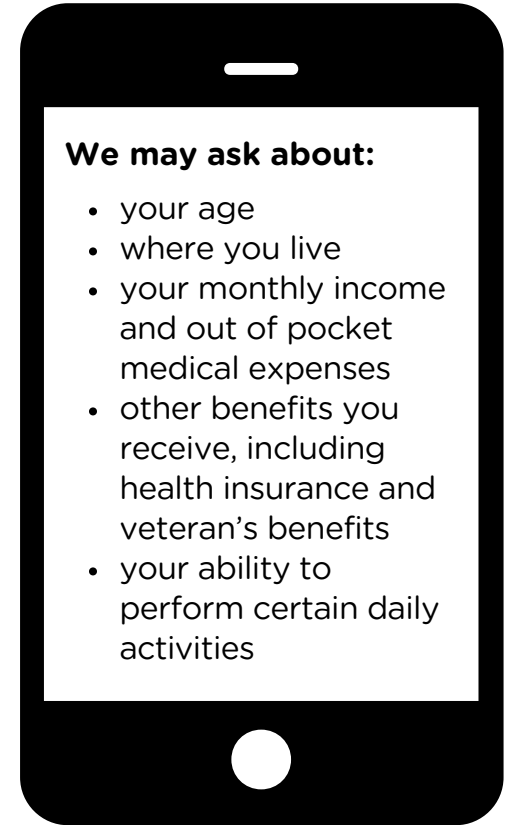
Because our programs are funded by tax dollars, we're required to ask certain questions to determine eligibility. Additionally, most programs require an in-home assessment to complete the eligibility process and begin services. All of this will be explained during your call.
